Frailty is a term that describes a gradual decline in a person's function. Someone who is frail may find it increasingly difficult to manage every day activities that they are used to doing independently. This in turn may affect their ability to manage at home.

My role will involve supporting these patients to remain well and independent. Aiming to prevent hospital admission and supporting patients upon discharge from hospital.

I look forward to working with the statutory and voluntary groups already supporting the surgery. Supporting carers and patient's families and alongside the Doctors, will undertake home visits to housebound patients.



Spotlight on Hay Fever

Hay fever season is fast approaching us and we would like to inform you of your options regarding hay fever treatment. If you are experiencing any hay fever symptoms (including runny nose, nasal congestion, watery, itchy or red eyes, sneezing, itchy nose etc) please visit your local chemist or supermarket to obtain over the counter treatment in the first instance.

Oral antihistamines, nasal sprays and eye drops are all available over the counter and can be purchased in chemists and most supermarkets.

Please only book an appointment here at the doctors if over the counter medications have not relieved your symptoms after using for a few weeks.

Appointments

Please do not be offended when the reception team ask you why you need an appointment. They have all been trained to ask specific questions to ensure that you get the right care, from the right professional in the right time frame!

Are you ringing on behalf of yourself or someone else? Be ready with DOB and name as well as details as to reason for your call and if you have seen anyone about this before or do you have a usual GP that you would like to see.

Our policy is to provide continuity of care, so we will always try to ensure that you see your usual GP or the same Doctor for an ongoing condition but this may not always be possible if Doctors time is taken up with minor ailments, conditions that could have waited a couple of days or those that could have been seen by a Nurse or referred to Pharmacy First.

At times you may not be able to see your usual GP due to annual leave, study leave, or your GP may be on call for urgent problems on the day. You may need to wait to see your usual GP.

Knowing why you need an appointment saves Doctors time and opens up appointments for those most in need. Please help us to help you!

Covid Booster Spring 2024

COVID-19 is more serious in older people and in people with certain underlying health conditions. For these reasons, people aged 75 years and over, those in care homes, and those aged 6 months and over with a weakened immune system are being offered a spring dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

The surgery is starting boosters at the end of April and If you are eligible you will be invited, with the highest risk patients being called in first.

If you are turning 75 years of age between April and June, you do not have to wait until your birthday, you can attend when you are called for your vaccination.

We will be vaccinating Care home and house bound patients first.
