Spotlight on shingles and the vaccination programme

Shingles is a viral infection that can occur at any age, but the risk and severity of shingles and its complications increase with age and is higher in individuals who have a severely weakened immune system.

You CANNOT CATCH Shingles. At least 9 in 10 adults are already infected with the virus that causes Shingles, (having had chickenpox as children) and around one in four people will go on to develop shingles in their lifetime – the risk of this increases with age.

For some, the pain caused by shingles (Post Herpetic Neuralgia) can last for many years. It can really affect your life, stopping you from doing all the things you usually enjoy.. Each year 14,000 people go on to develop this pain with over 1400 people being admitted to hospital due to it.

The most effective way to reduce the incidence of shingles and its complications is to have the shingles vaccine. It has been shown to reduce the risk of developing shingles, lessen the severity of the cases that do happen and boost immunity against further shingles attacks

All patients between the ages of 70 and 79 years of age have been eligible for many years but the programme has recently been extended to include those between the ages of 60-69. HOWEVER this is being introduced on a 10 year rolling programme.

Year one which is our current year is for those born between 1st September 1953- 31st August 1954 and between 1st September 1958 and 31st August 1959.

If you are between 60 and 69 and your date of birth does not fall between these dates please see the following information regarding when you become eligible. The chart can be found at *Shingles vaccination – all year round! Eligibility poster* (publishing.service.gov.uk)

Only patients with a weakened immune system are eligible from the age of 50

Please do not try to book an appointment for a shingles vaccine unless you fall into the criteria as it is not possible for our team to give the vaccine outside of this criteria.

The surgery will contact you when you become eligible





Eligibility for shingles vaccine

If you have a severely weakened immune system (as described in the Green book chapter) you will be offered the shingles vaccine from 50 years of age

If you are over 70 years of age and have not had shingles vaccine before you remain eligible up to your 80th birthday

New changes to the Mirena Coil

As a surgery we provide the service to fit and remove Mirena coils. The Mirena coil has historically held a 5 year license for contraceptive use, for heavy menstrual bleeding and for HRT.


The Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare (FSRH) and Bayer, who manufacture the Mirena, have recently informed healthcare providers that the licensing for the Mirena coil for contraception purposes has changed. The Mirena coil is now licensed for, and effective for, 8 years for contraceptive use. This means it can stay in for 8 years in total irrespective of when the coil was fitted. For heavy menstrual bleeding it is licensed for 8 years IF the individual is not experiencing any vaginal bleeding. If bleeding is occurring then it needs to be changed at 5 years BUT if no bleeding is experienced it can again remain in for 8 years in total.

The licensing for HRT has not changed and the Mirena coil needs to be changed every 5 years.

If you currently have a Mirena coil in situ for contraceptive purposes we will automatically change your recall date to 8 years from the date it was fitted in line with the new guidelines. If you have already spoken to myself about a coil removal and refit I will be contacting you individually to discuss this change in licensing.
